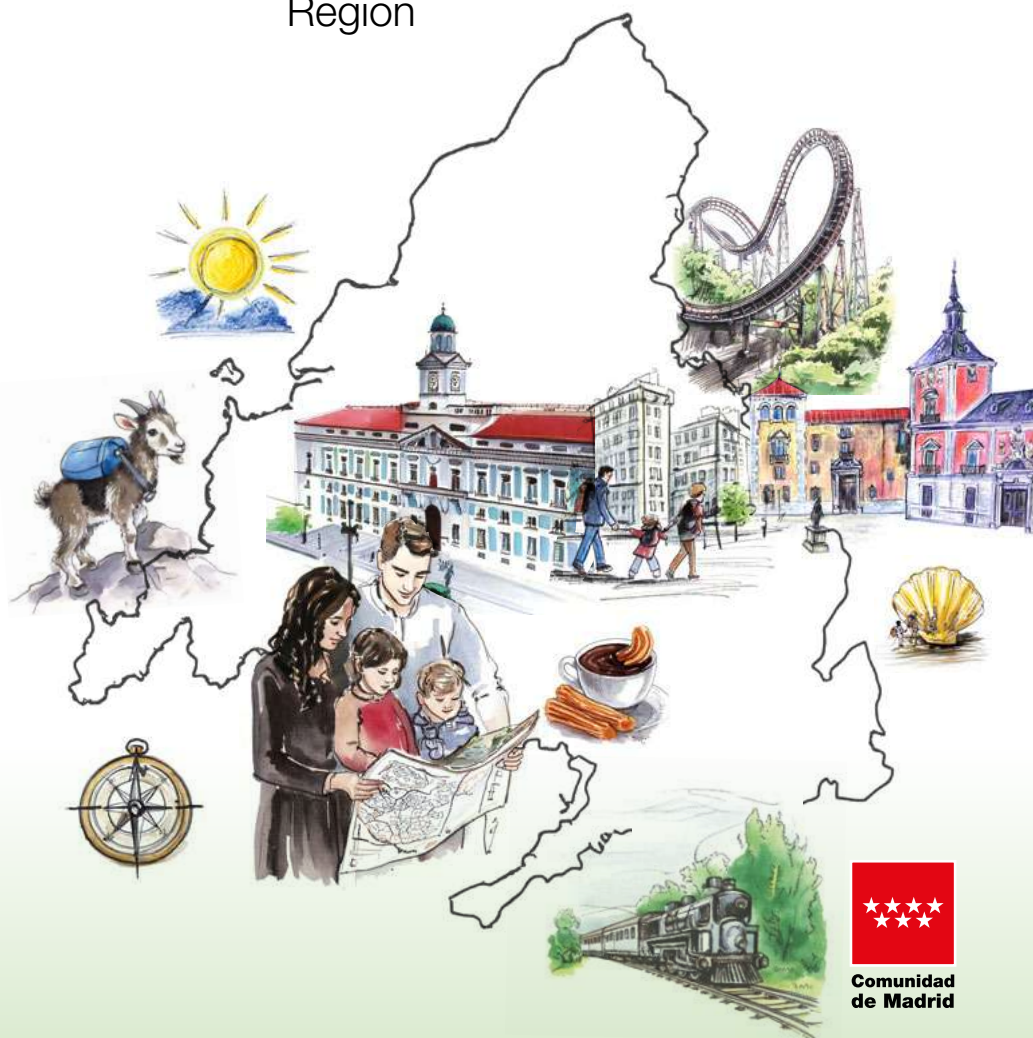

A visit to Madrid would be incomplete without experiencing some of the city's iconic attractions, such as strolling through **El Rastro** on Sundays or attending the changing of the guard at the **Royal Palace** in Madrid every Wednesday or Saturday. Additionally, sampling the city's renowned food culture, including a fried-squid sandwich or a chocolate with churros, is a must.

To get to know the Community of Madrid in depth, we suggest you discover our four World Heritage cultural destinations (**The Landscape of Light** in the capital, **Alcalá de Henares**, **Aranjuez** and **San Lorenzo de El Escorial**) and the **Montejo Beech Forest**, a Natural World Heritage Site.

You also cannot miss the **Guadarrama National Park** or the Sierra del **Rincón Biosphere Reserve**, as well as the countless charming villages in our four tourist regions, full of active tourism and nature plans.

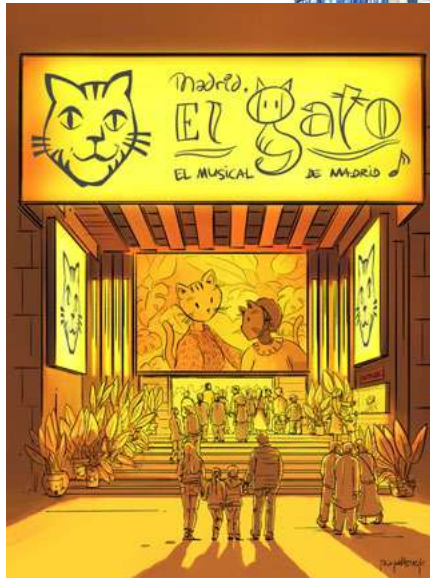

If science is calling you, you can visit the **National Museum of Natural Sciences**, the **National Museum of Science and Technology** or the **Geomineral Museum**... The possibilities are endless!

Don't forget to visit the many attractions that the Madrid Region has to offer. **The Archaeological and Paleontological Museum of the Community of Madrid** is a great place to learn about the history of the region, while the **Centro de Arte Dos de Mayo (CA2M)** is the ideal venue for those who appreciate cutting-edge art. Visit the **Lope de Vega House** and **Cervantes House Museums** to gain a deeper understanding of the lives and times of two of Madrid's most famous residents.

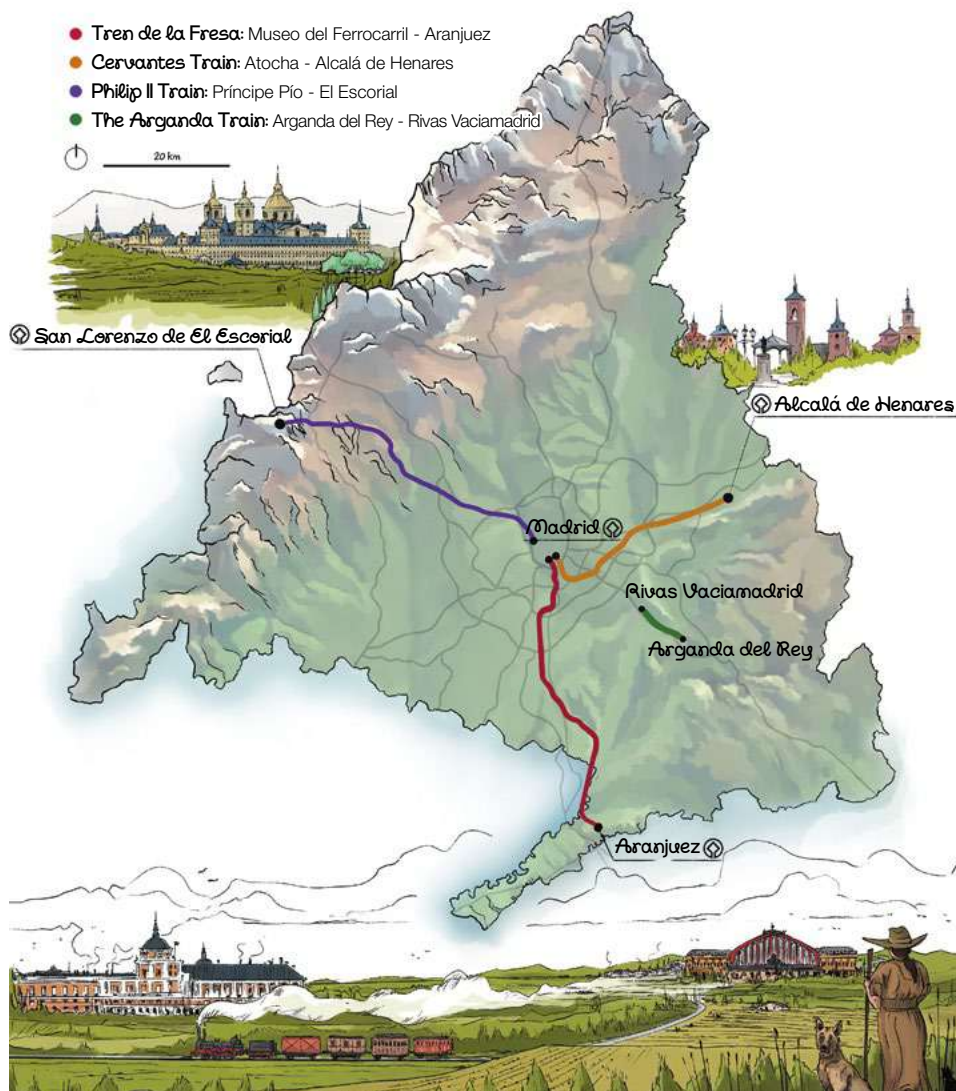

Madrid offers visitors the unique opportunity to travel in time. You read that right! There are three time machines! Come and enjoy a fantastic journey on one of our three magnificent historic trains, which connect the capital with our wonderful UNESCO World Heritage Sites. On the **Tren de la Fresa**, you'll be transported back the romantic era of Queen Isabel II, and you'll even get to indulge in fresh strawberries from Aranjuez! If you decide to take the **Philip II Train**, who commissioned the Royal Site of San Lorenzo de El Escorial, you'll be taking a journey back in time to the golden age of the Spanish empire! The very king of the Spanish empire at the time of its greatest splendour, where 'the sun never set', will accompany you on the journey. You simply must take the **Cervantes Train** to Alcalá. It's an amazing trip where you'll get to know Alcalá de Henares and the Prince of Wit (Cervantes himself), accompanied by the characters from his works.

You'll find it along the Vía Verde (Greenway) del Tajuña, the Vía Verde del Guadarrama and the Vía Verde del Tren de los 40 días.

No matter where you're headed, there's a route for you: wind your way through the stunning **Sierra Norte** along the Red de Caminos de la Carpetania, discover the breathtaking **Sierra de Guadarrama** through the Valle de la Barranca, or take in the incredible Pedrezuela Reservoir. In the Sierra Oeste, the route of the Molinos del río Cofio or the Hornillo waterfall await you. Get ready to explore the incredible **Vegas** and the breathtaking **Alcarria Madrileña** through the Prehistoric Caves of Perales de Tajuña or the Roman Bridge of Valquemada. Get ready to discover a whole new side of Madrid! The Gasco Dam Route in Las Rozas de Madrid and Torrelodones, and the Dehesa Bonita de El Escorial route are just waiting to be discovered...

In our region, there are five officially registered bathing areas, where water quality is monitored periodically throughout the summer. The following bathing areas are monitored for water quality: **Las Presillas, Los Villares, El Muro, Virgen de la Nueva** and **Playa del Alberche**.

There's no better way to discover Madrid's incredible natural resources than by visiting one of the city's eight amazing Environmental Education Centres. These fantastic facilities are in some of the most beautiful and protected natural areas in the city, including forest parks. Here you will find information about the area you are going to visit: its fauna and flora, its resources, its cultural and natural heritage... as well as workshops and activities to enjoy nature and leisure: guided tours, walks or exhibitions, many of which are designed for children.

You can find all the information about these centres on the Madrid Region website. No matter where you are in the region, you'll never be far from an Environmental Education Centre. If you're heading to the incredible Sierra de Ayllón, you absolutely must check out the Hayedo de Montejo. It's an ancient beech and oak tree meadow that's been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Madrid has a truly special light at Christmas. Something magical takes over the streets, and it's impossible not to want to go out and soak up the Christmas atmosphere, especially with the little ones. But it's also contagious for adults! Everything is dressed up and is a special time of year in the city. There are nativity scenes, the Three Kings' parade, the Christmas bus, the skating rinks, the Christmas markets... the list goes on!



The month of light

Here are some suggestions for enjoying Christmas in the Madrid Region, but there are many more: there is something to do every day of the year:

Nativity scenes are a must! There are so many incredible ones to see, from living nativity scenes like the one in **Buitrago del Lozoya** to monumental ones like the one in **San Lorenzo de El Escorial** and classic ones like the one in the **Real Casa de Correos in Puerta del Sol**, which is the headquarters of the Presidency of the Community of Madrid.

The **Three Kings parade** is the most eagerly awaited event for the little ones. The one that runs through Madrid's centre is one of the most colourful, but you can find a welcome for their majesties in every corner of the region.

Other Christmas plans are **Cortylandia** or **Juvenalia (Madrid)**, **Navidalia (Getafe)** or **Mágicas Navidades (Torrejón de Ardoz)**.

If you are looking for something different, try the Christmas bus or train (Madrid).

Spring

The spring celebration is very present in the region, with long-standing festivals such as **the Mayan Festival** in El Molar and Colmenar Viejo (FITN). **Dos de Mayo** (2 May) is an important date that you must mark in your diary! It's the day of the Madrid Region and it has special relevance in Móstoles (FITN), where the resistance to the French invasion began. And there's more! 15 May is celebrated in honour of the patron saint of Madrid, **San Isidro**. You simply must check out the **book fair**, one of the most important cultural events in Madrid's spring festivities. **Holy Week** is a truly special time in the region, with incredible processions including the most popular ones are La Pasión de Chinchón (FITN) and the Semana Santa de Parla (FITR), which are absolute must-sees for tourists.

Summer



The holidays are coming. Plans are already starting to come in thick and fast. There are cultural events to enjoy, like **Teatralia Circus** and **Escenas de Verano** (part of family theatre festival). Some of them have a traditional flavour, such as the **verbena de la Paloma** 15 August (verbena is a type of open-air street party popular across Spain) or the **Boat of the Virgin of Alarilla** in Fuentidueña de Tajo (FITR). You can become an **archaeologist for a day** (from June to September), enjoy the **Medieval Fair in Buitrago del Lozoya** or the **Mutiny Festival in Aranjuez**. The summer is a fantastic time for festivals in the region, but especially in September. There are so many to choose from, but a few of the highlights are the **Cristo de los Remedios** in San Sebastián de los Reyes (28 to 3 September) (FITN), the **Romería de la Virgen de Gracia** (FITN) and the **Virgen de la Herrería** in El Escorial (first Sunday in September) (FITR).

Autumn



Autumn is a truly magical time in the Madrid Region, with a whole host of fantastic festive events celebrating the local culture and traditions. One of the absolute highlights is the **Villa de Aranjuez Balloon Festival**, where the sky is filled with colour, and you can enjoy some truly impressive exhibitions of hot air balloons. **The Alcalá de Henares Cervantes Week** (FITN) is an incredible journey back in time. The city comes alive with crafts, shows and culinary delights, immersing you in the world of Cervantes. **Halloween** celebrations are also very popular in Paracuellos and Villar del Olmo, where the streets are filled with amazing decorations and lots of fun activities for children. In the cultural sphere, the **FLIC: Children's and Young People's Literature and Arts Festival** and the **Children's and Young People's Book Fair**, which take place from April to February, promote reading and the arts among young people. And there's more! The **Madrid Book Fair** is all about celebrating the love of literature, while the historic **Complutum Renacida** in Alcalá de Henares brings the region's Roman past back to life. You simply must also go to the **Hispanic Heritage Day** parade on 12 October.

Winter



In winter, apart from the Christmas festivities, the municipality has important dates: in Pedrezuela, on 20 January, the **Fiesta de la Vaquilla** is held, a festive tradition declared of National Tourist Interest, which revives ancestral customs with parades and music. In February, the **Vaquillas de Colmenar Viejo** (old-fashioned bullfights) are held, in which young people pretend to be bulls made out of frames, while carnival is celebrated in many towns with **colourful parades**. Winter is also a time for the arts, with the amazing **Teatralia Festival** offering a fantastic programme of performing arts shows for all ages. At last, in Braojos, the traditional **Pastorela** brings the true spirit of Christmas back to life with its symbolically charged shepherds' representations. Also in winter, the **International Magic Festival, Inverfest New Rockers**, takes place.

The region is home to some truly delicious sweets, with specialties like **torrijas** during Easter, **turrónes** and **marzipans** during Christmas, and **doughnuts**, **Huesos de Santo**, and **buñuelos de viento** on All Saints' Day.

And then there are the other mouth-watering treats that are part of a town's cuisine. Think of the Palmeritas de **chocolate** pasteries from **Morata de Tajuña**, **Garrapiñadas** and **rosquillas** from **Alcalá de Henares**, **Bizcotelas** from **San Lorenzo de El Escorial**, **chocolate truffles** from **Valdemoro** or marmalades from **Loeches**.

And finally, there are some things that are an indivisible part of Madrid's DNA! Think **chocolate con churros**, **barquillos**, **violet sweets** and the stunning **Corona de la Almudena**. You simply must try them at any time of the year and in any corner of the region.

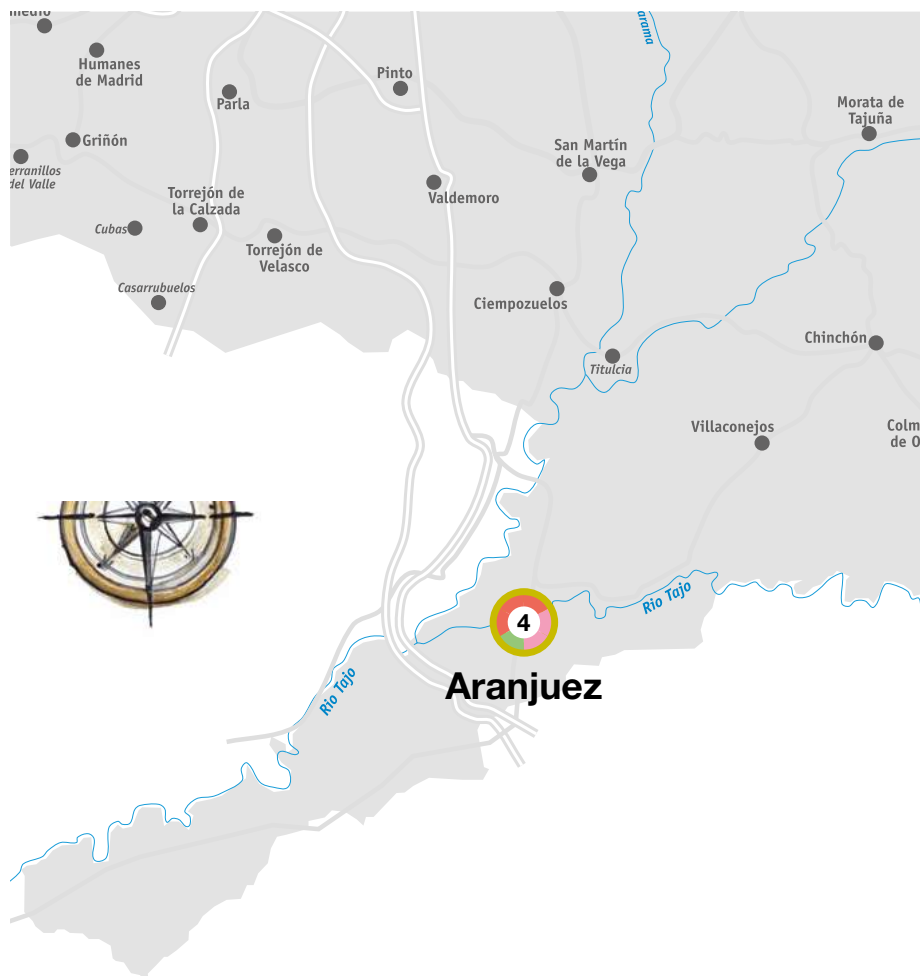
