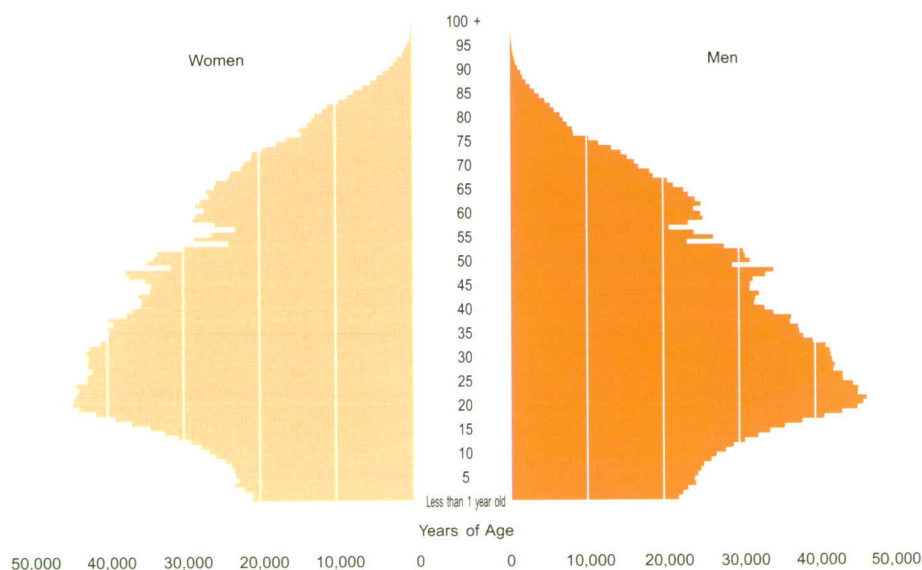

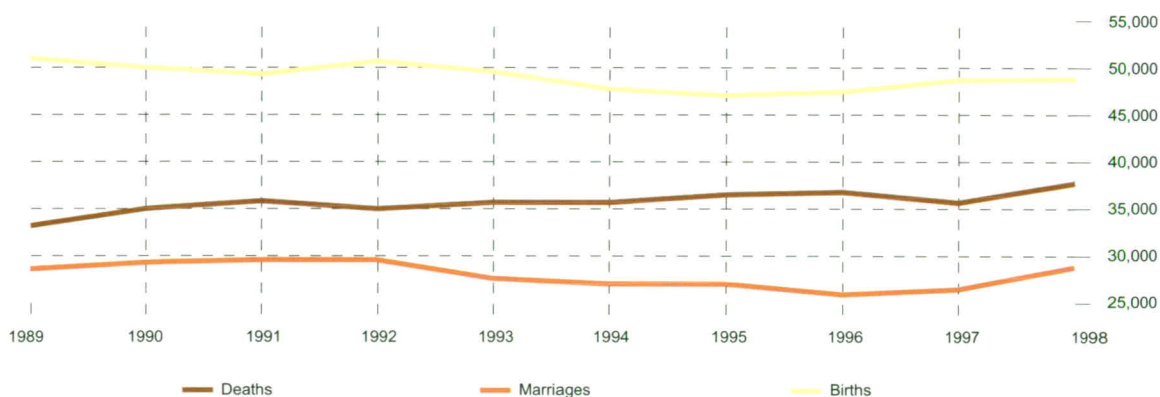

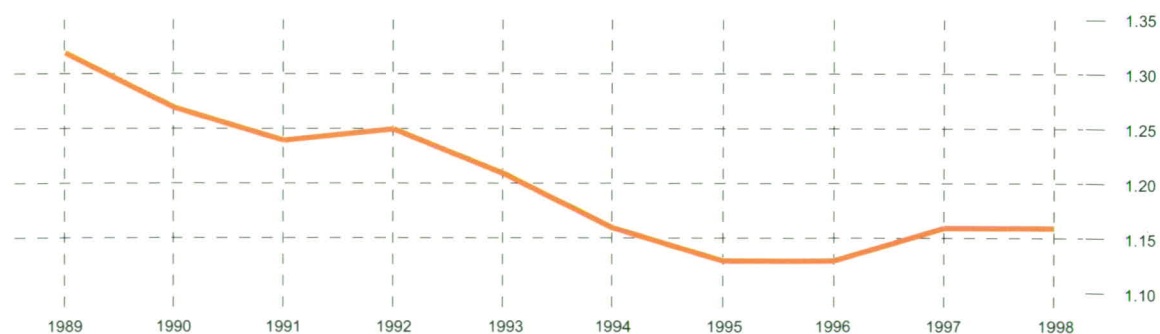

## 2.4. Year-on-year changes in births, deaths and marriages

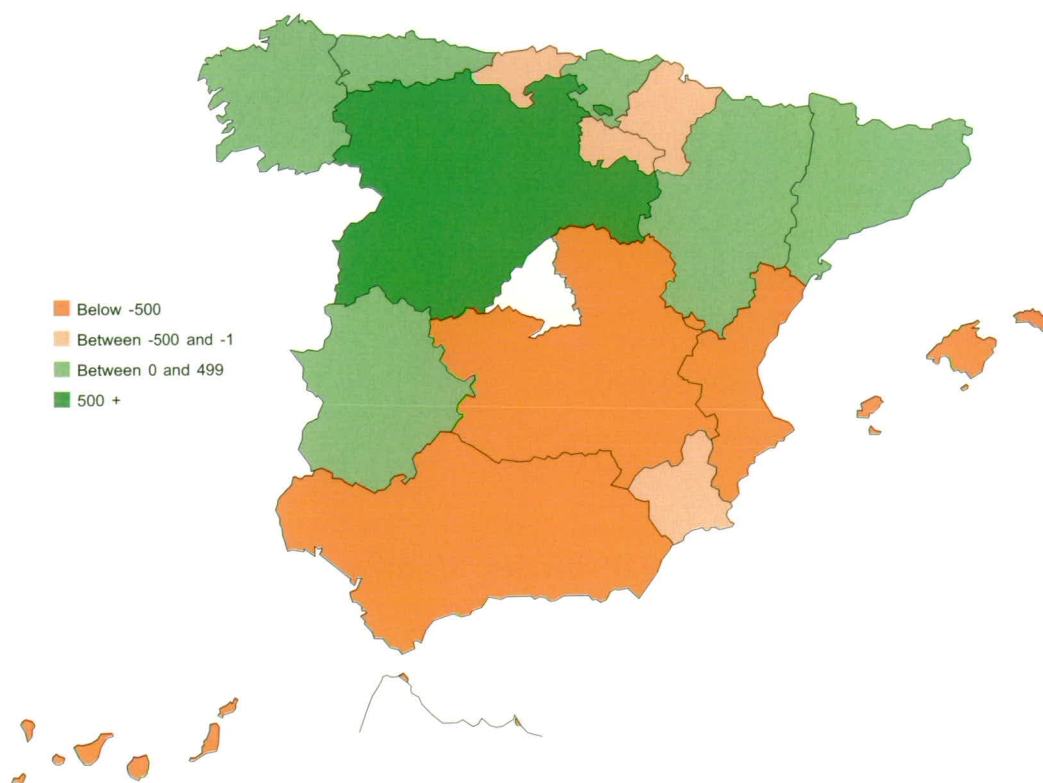


## 2.5. Year-on-year changes in the average number of children per woman

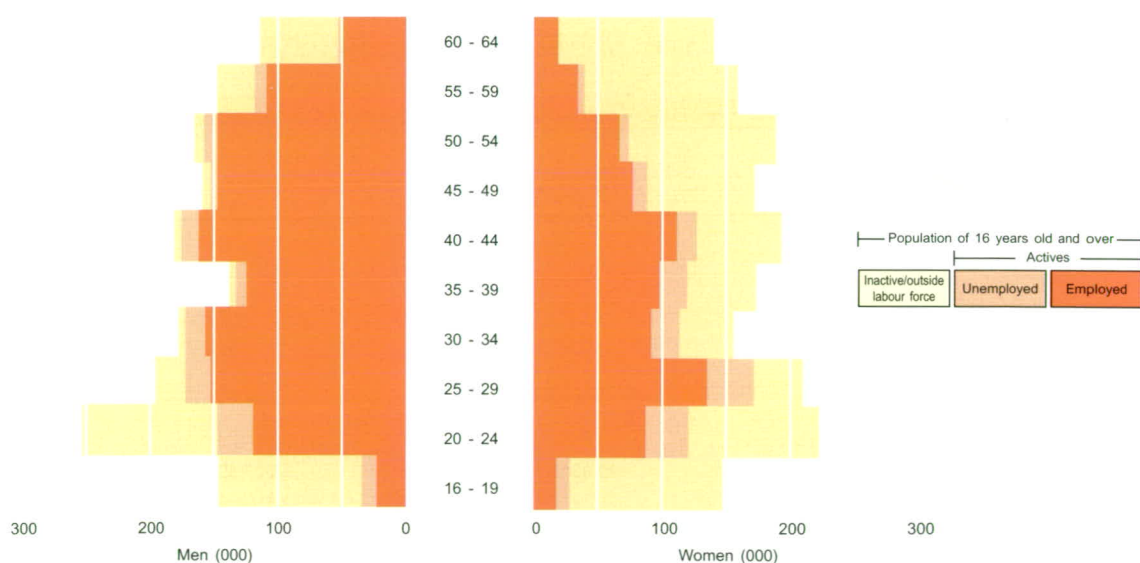

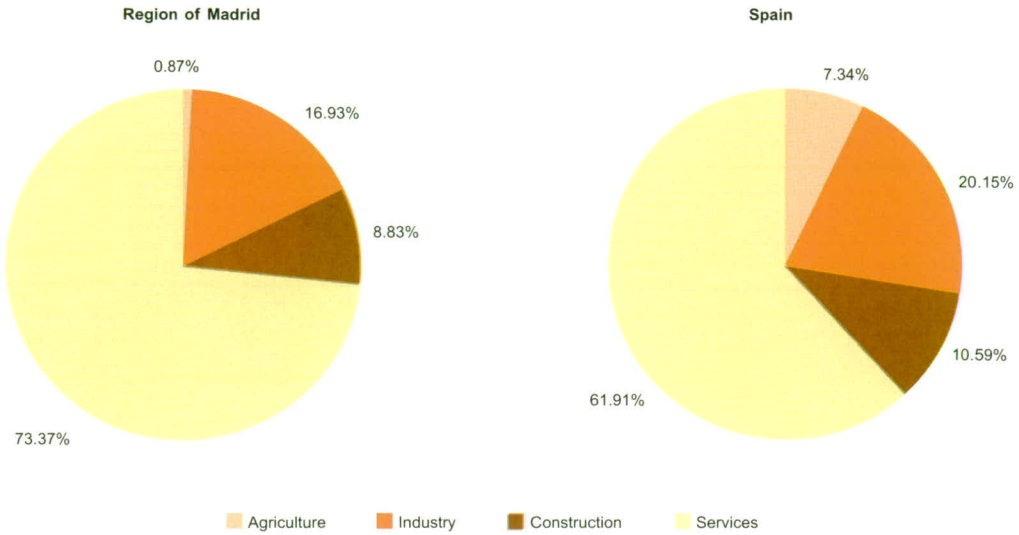

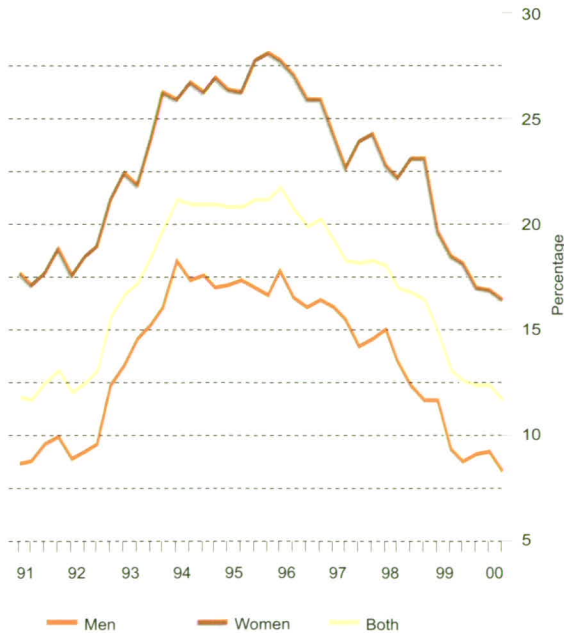
### 3.2. Breakdown of the employment status by age and sex. 1999



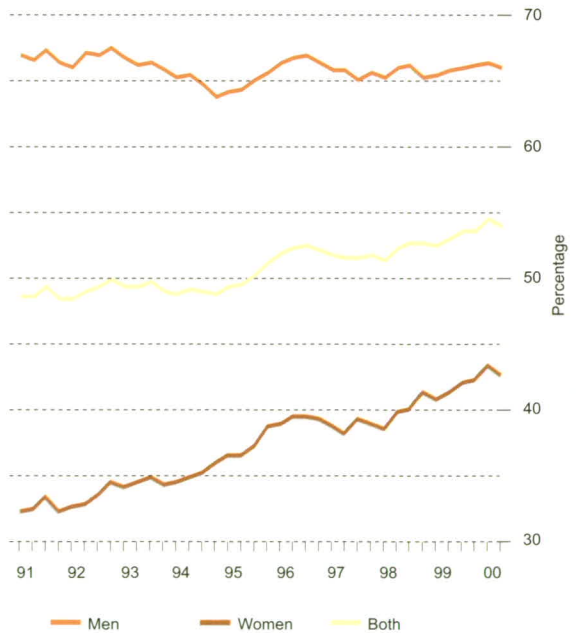
### 3.3. Breakdown of employment by sectors. 1999

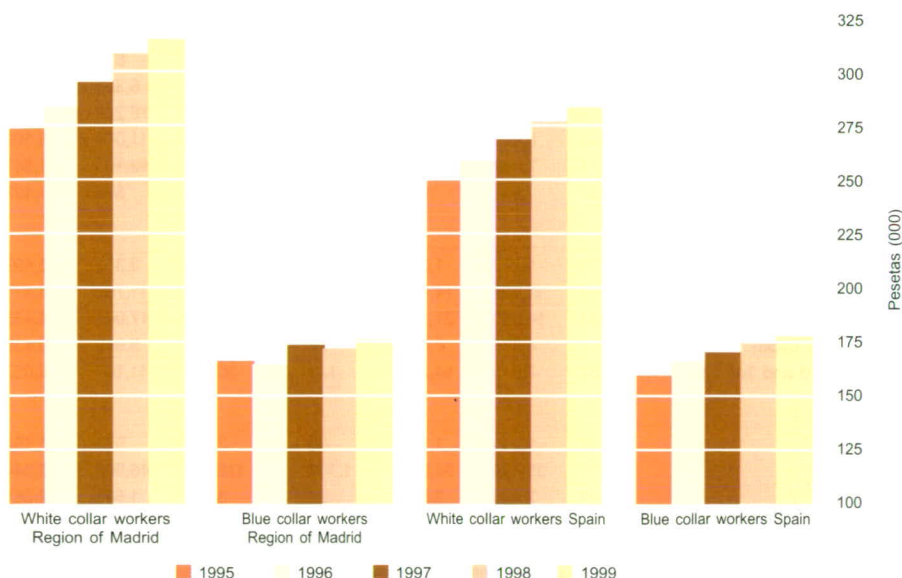

### 4.2. Average monthly earnings per worker (total pay including overtime)





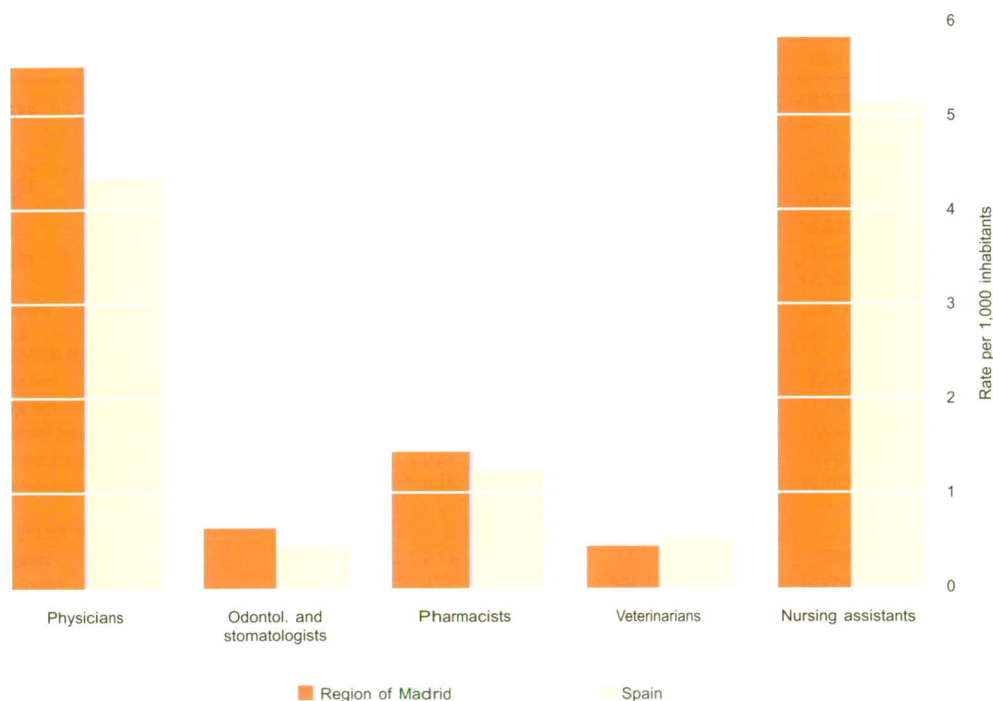

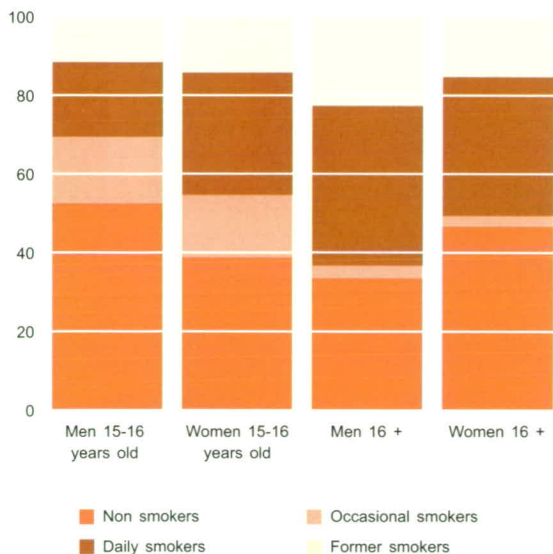

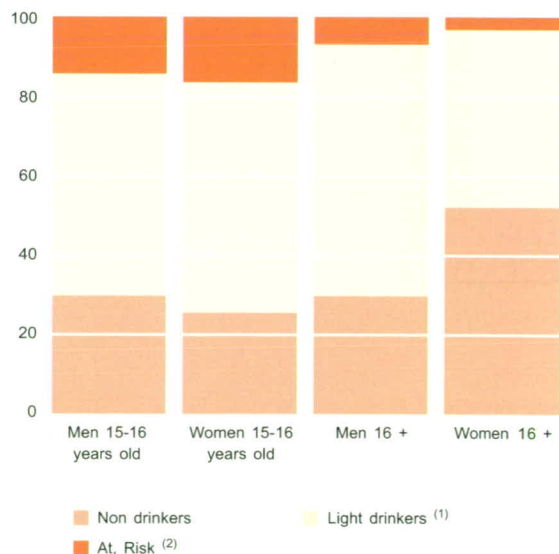

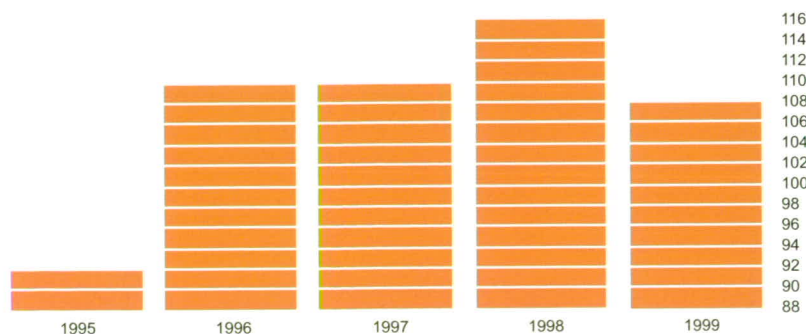

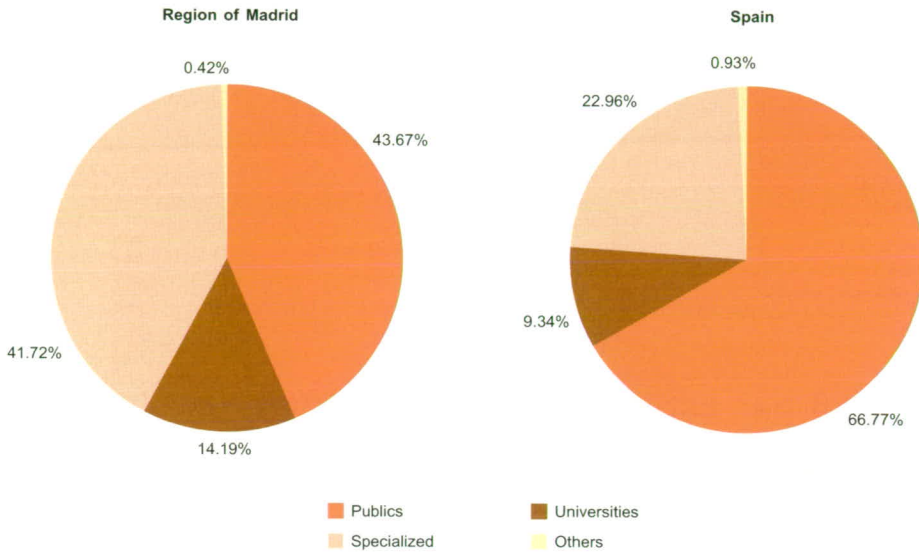

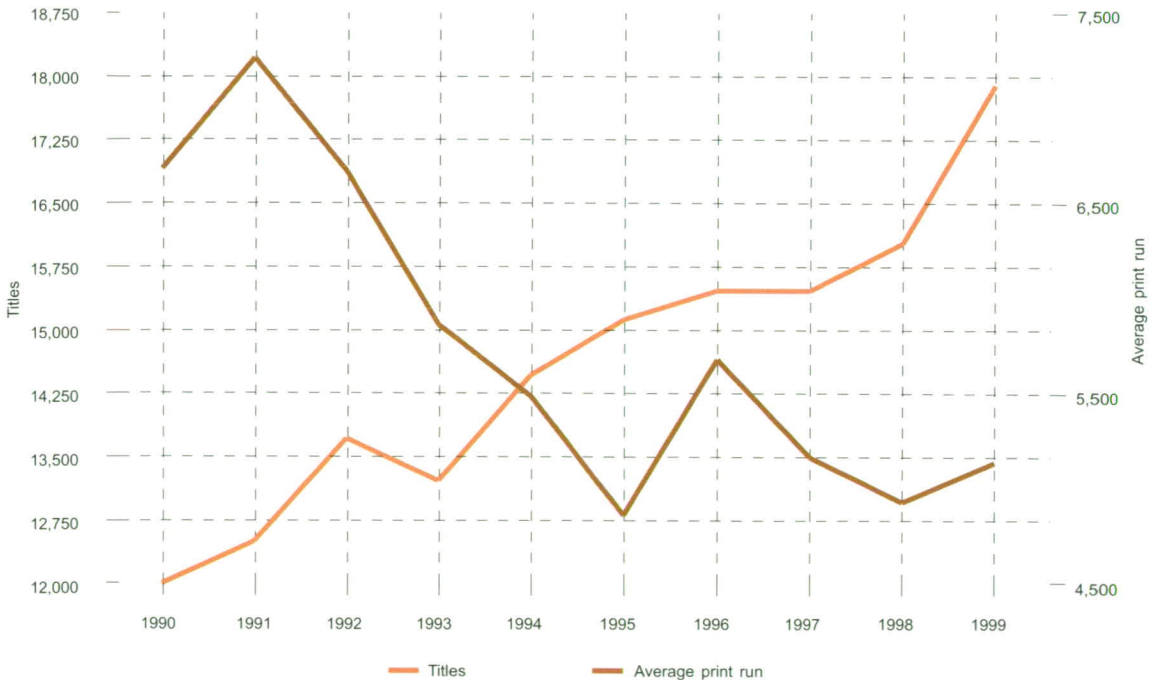

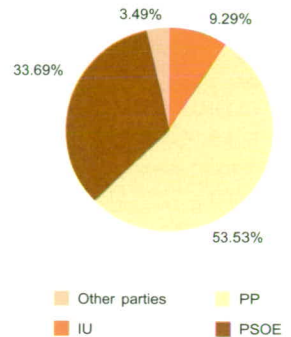

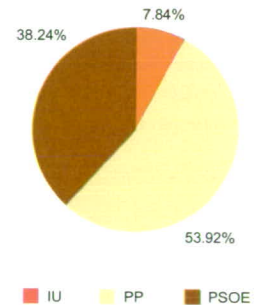
Breakdown of votes for Parties and Coalitions

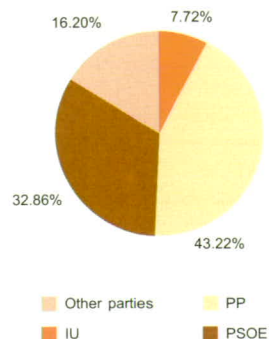
Breakdown of the seats. 1999

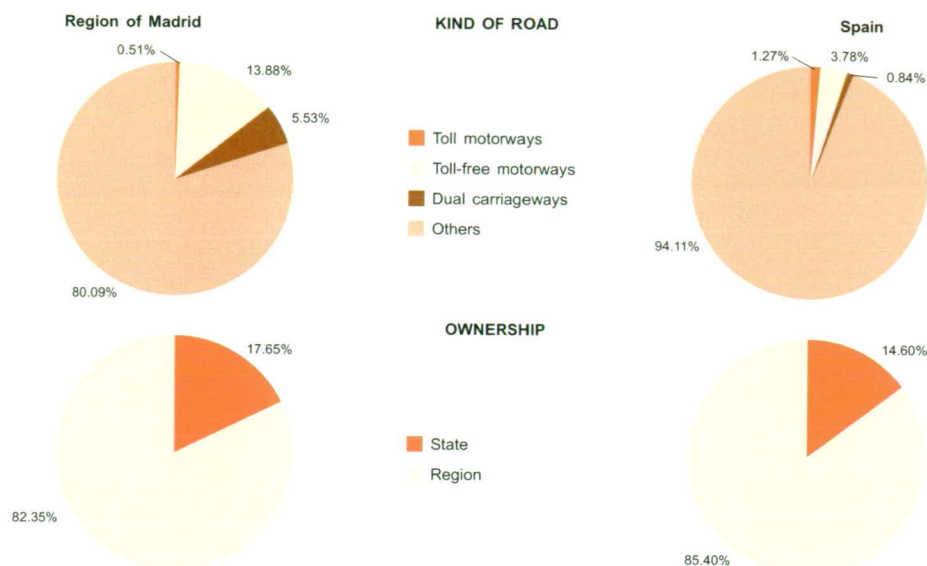

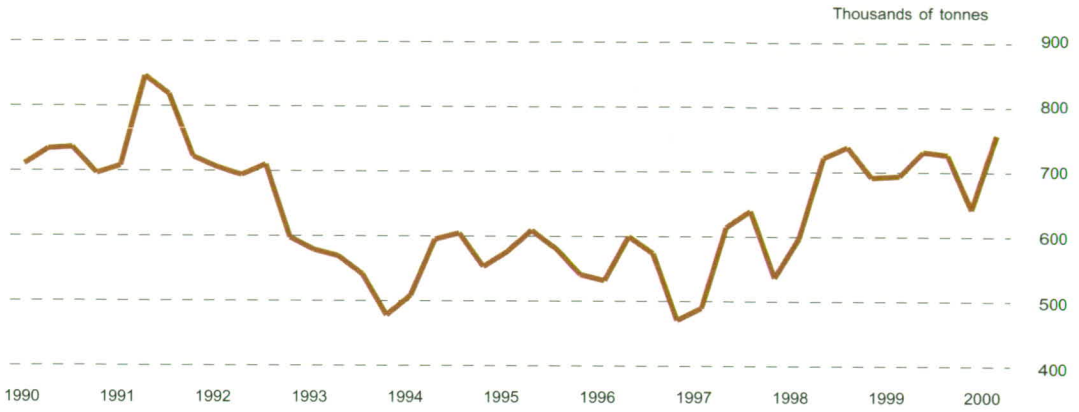

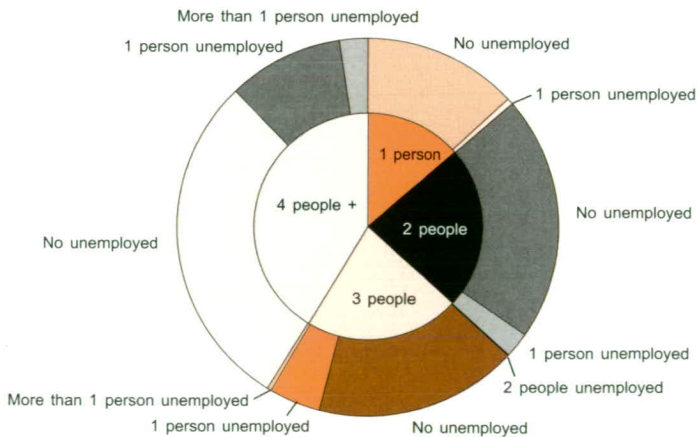
### 10.3. Quarterly change in sales of concrete



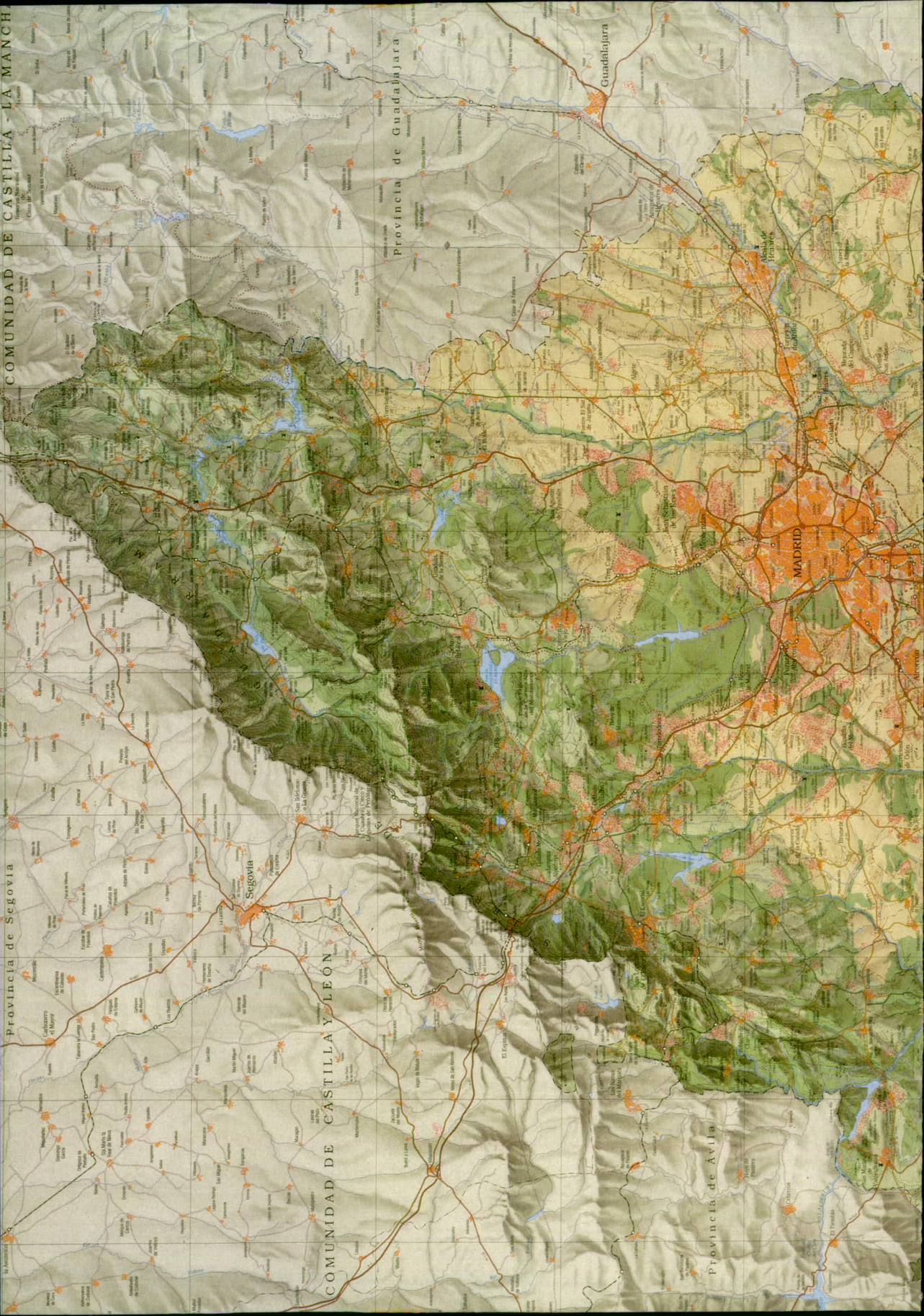
### 10.4. Price per m<sup>2</sup> of new build and existing housing



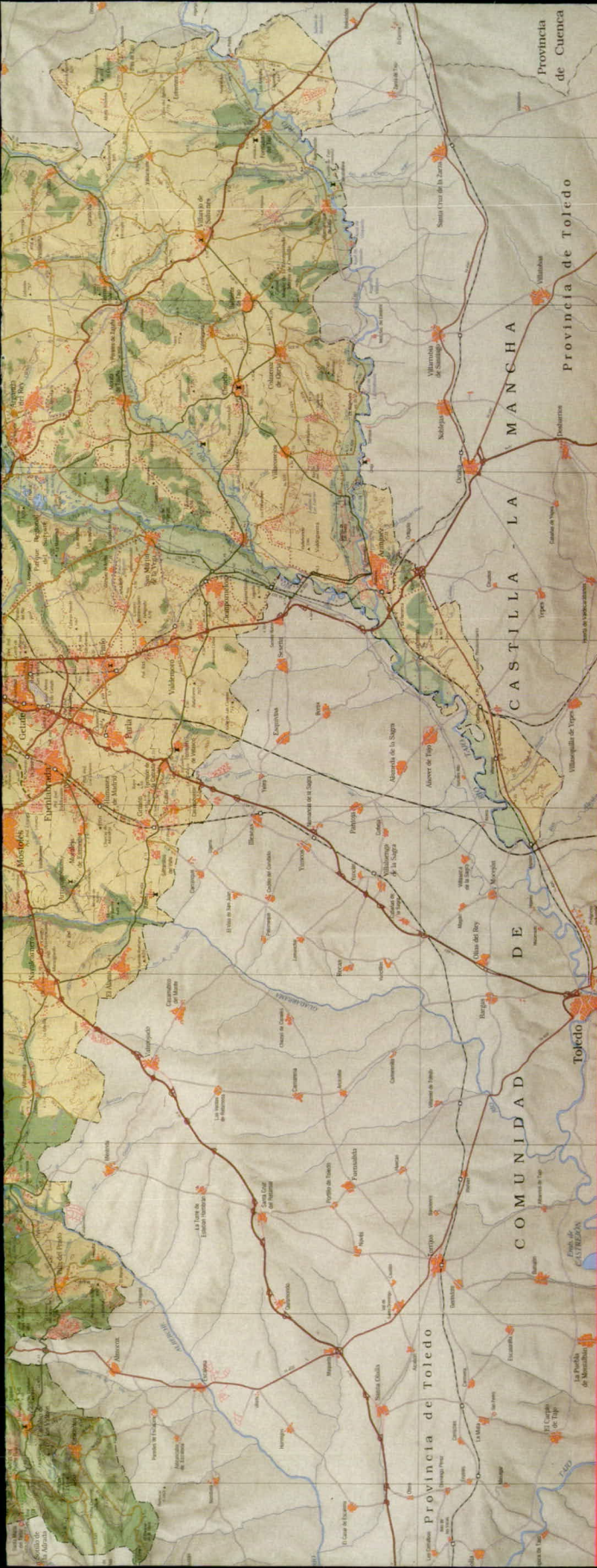
### 10.5. Breakdown of the unemployment by household in the Region of Madrid. 1999









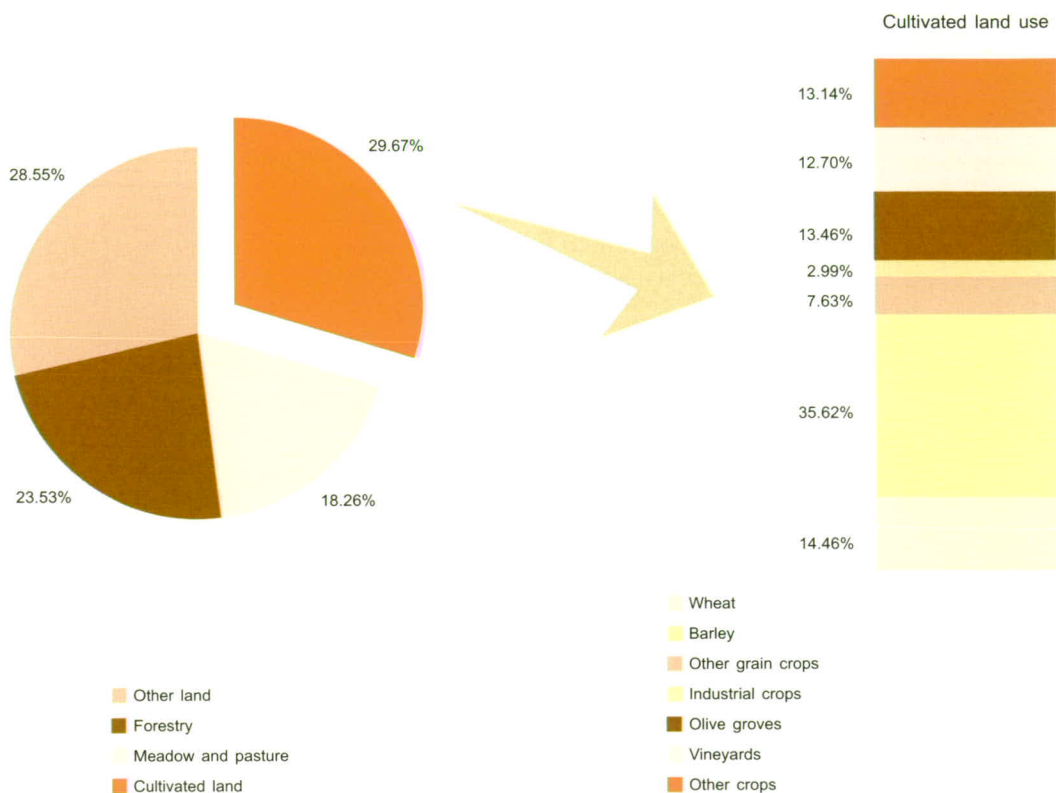

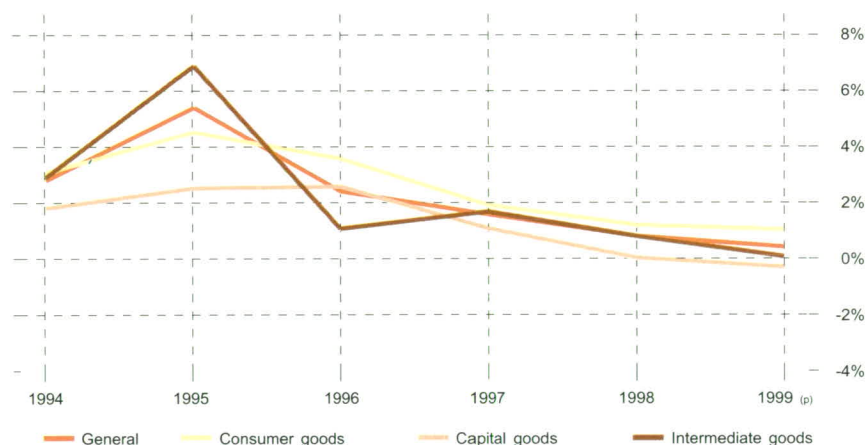

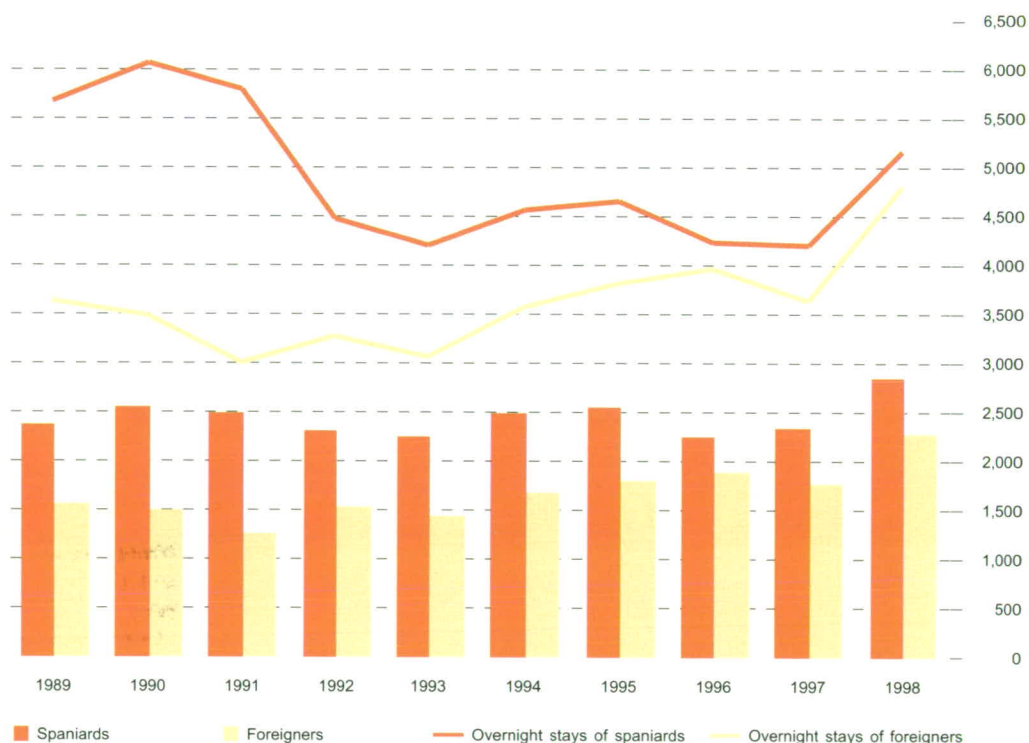

### 13.4. Visitors to the Region of Madrid and overnight stays in tourist accomodation



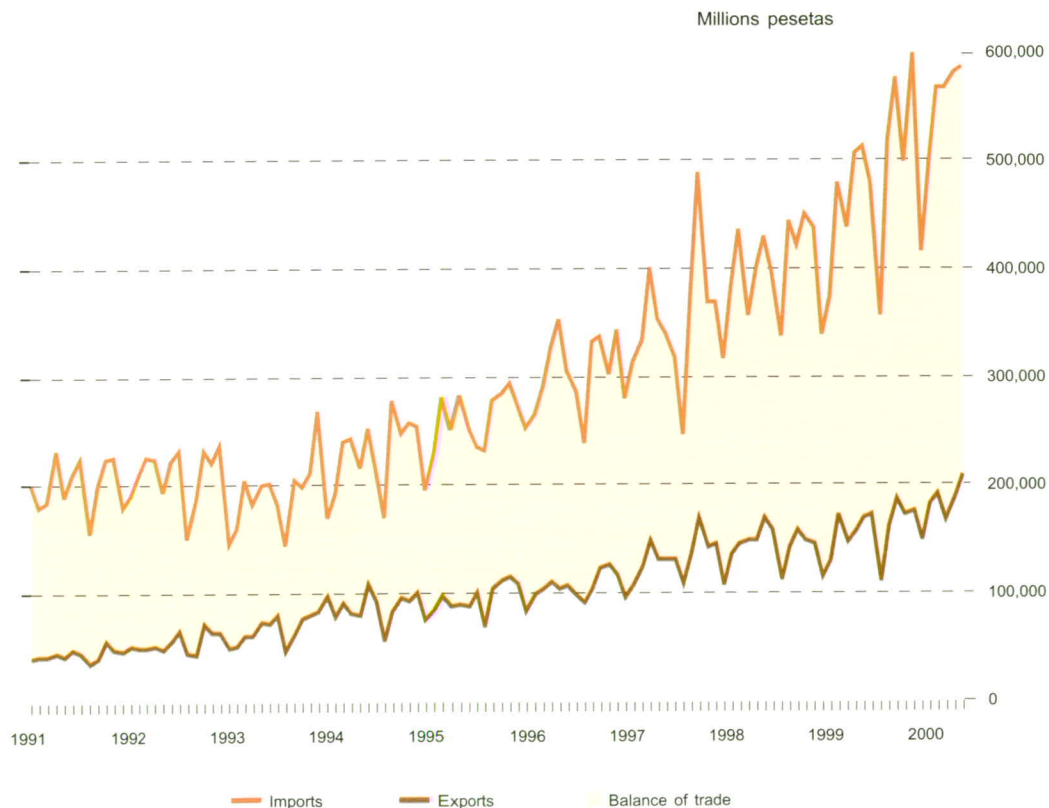

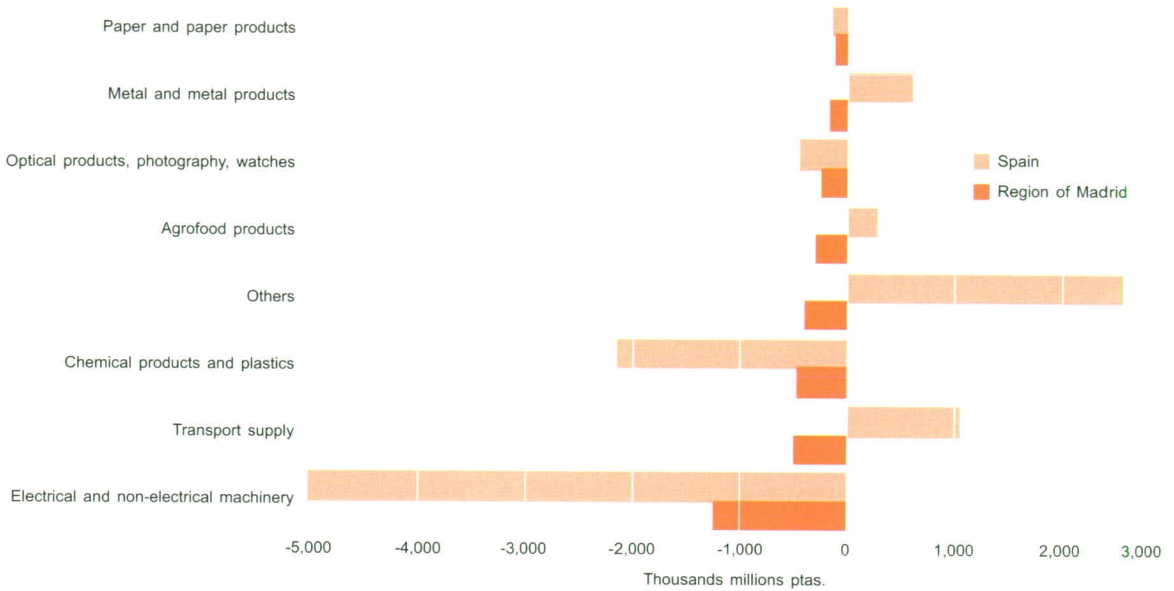

## 13.6. Year-on-year change in foreign trade



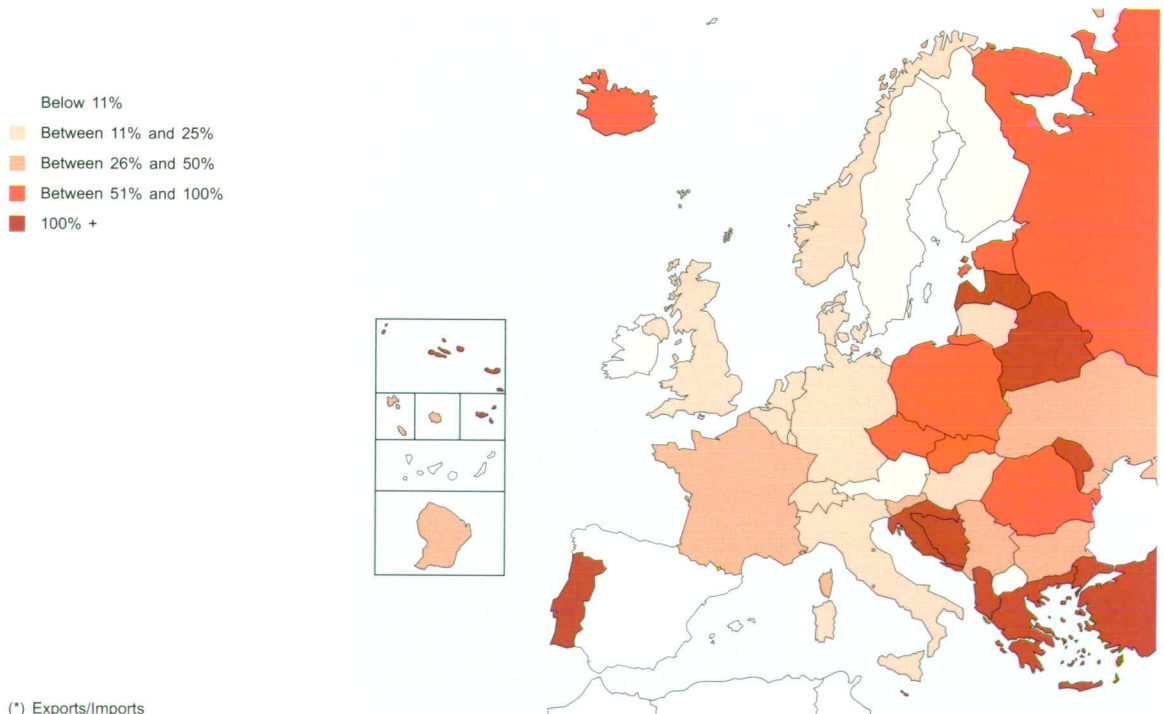


### 13.7. Balance of trade by products\*. 1998

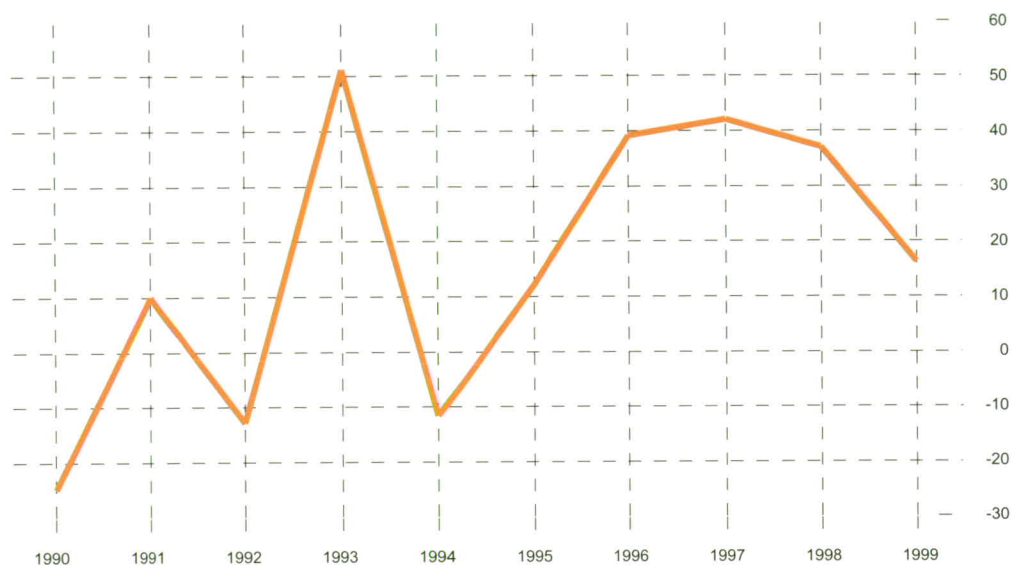

## 14.5. Year-on-year change in the Madrid Stock Exchange general index



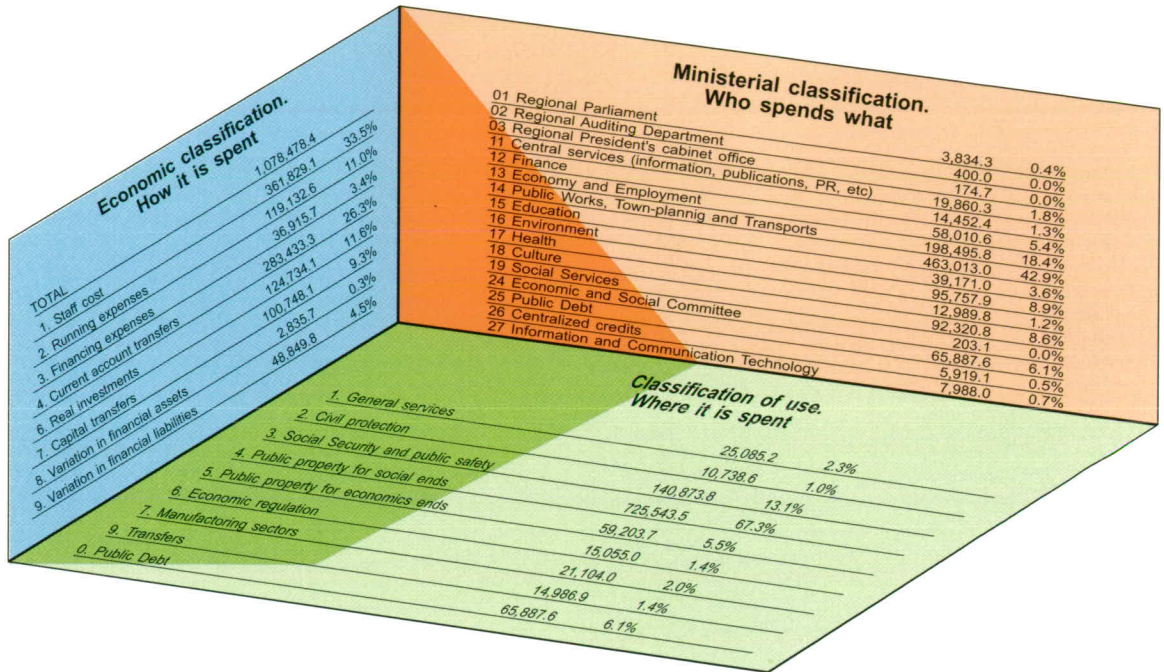

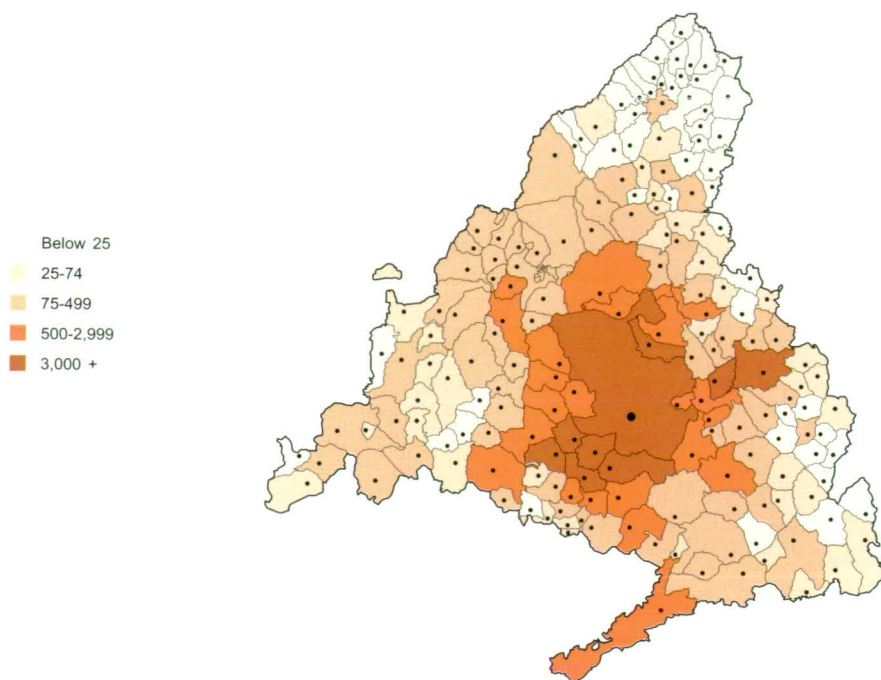




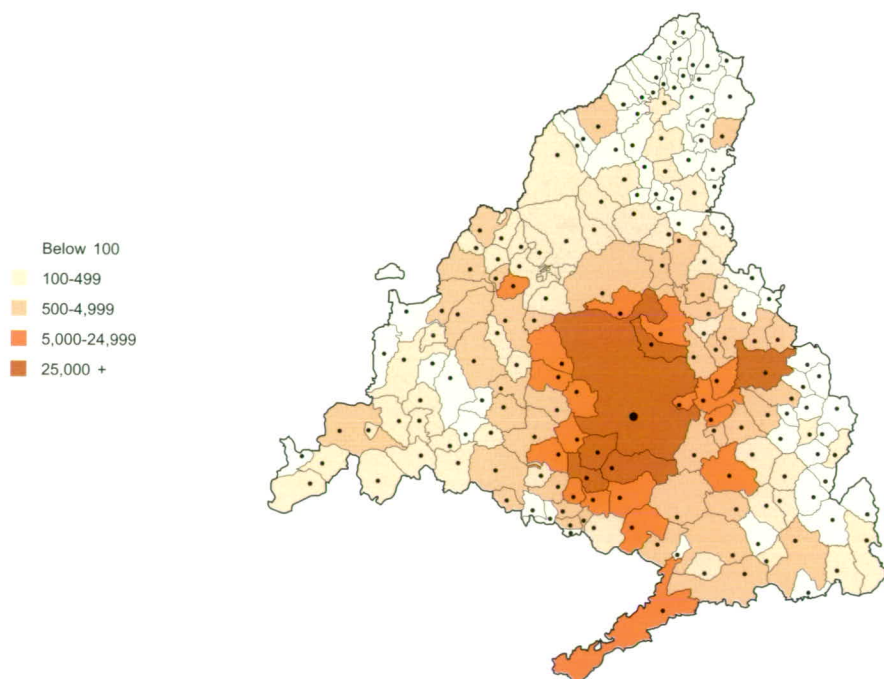




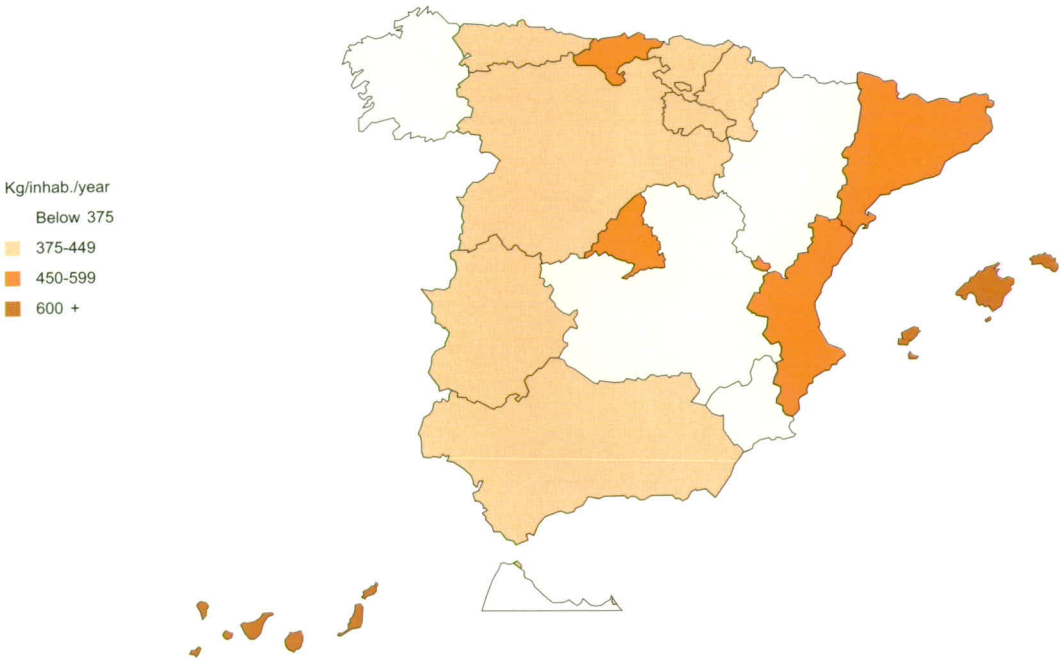
## 17.4. Economic activity units. 1998



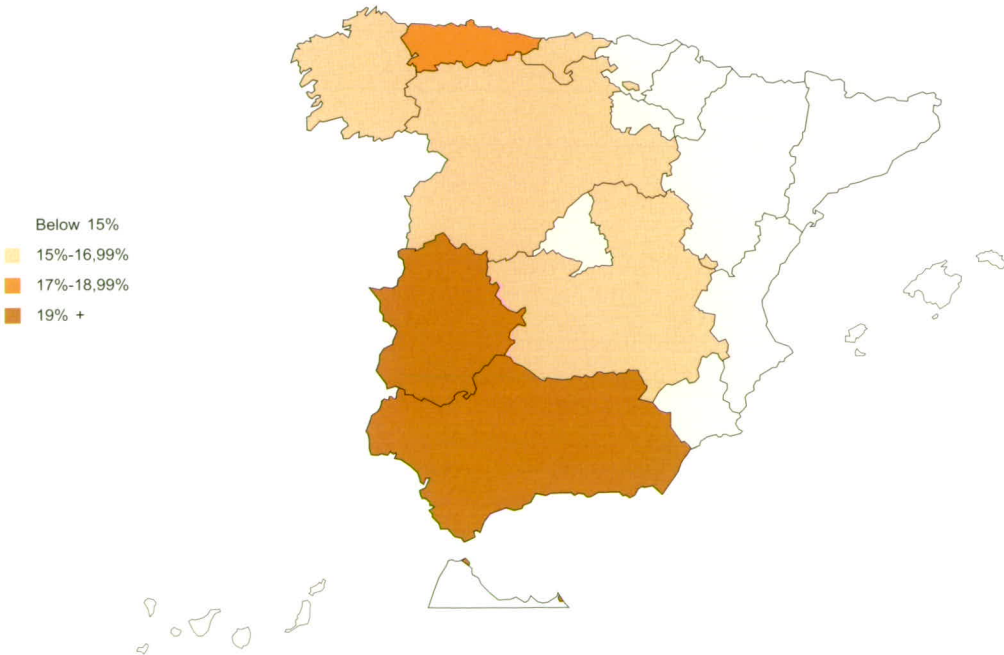
## 17.5. Employed in economic activity units. 1998

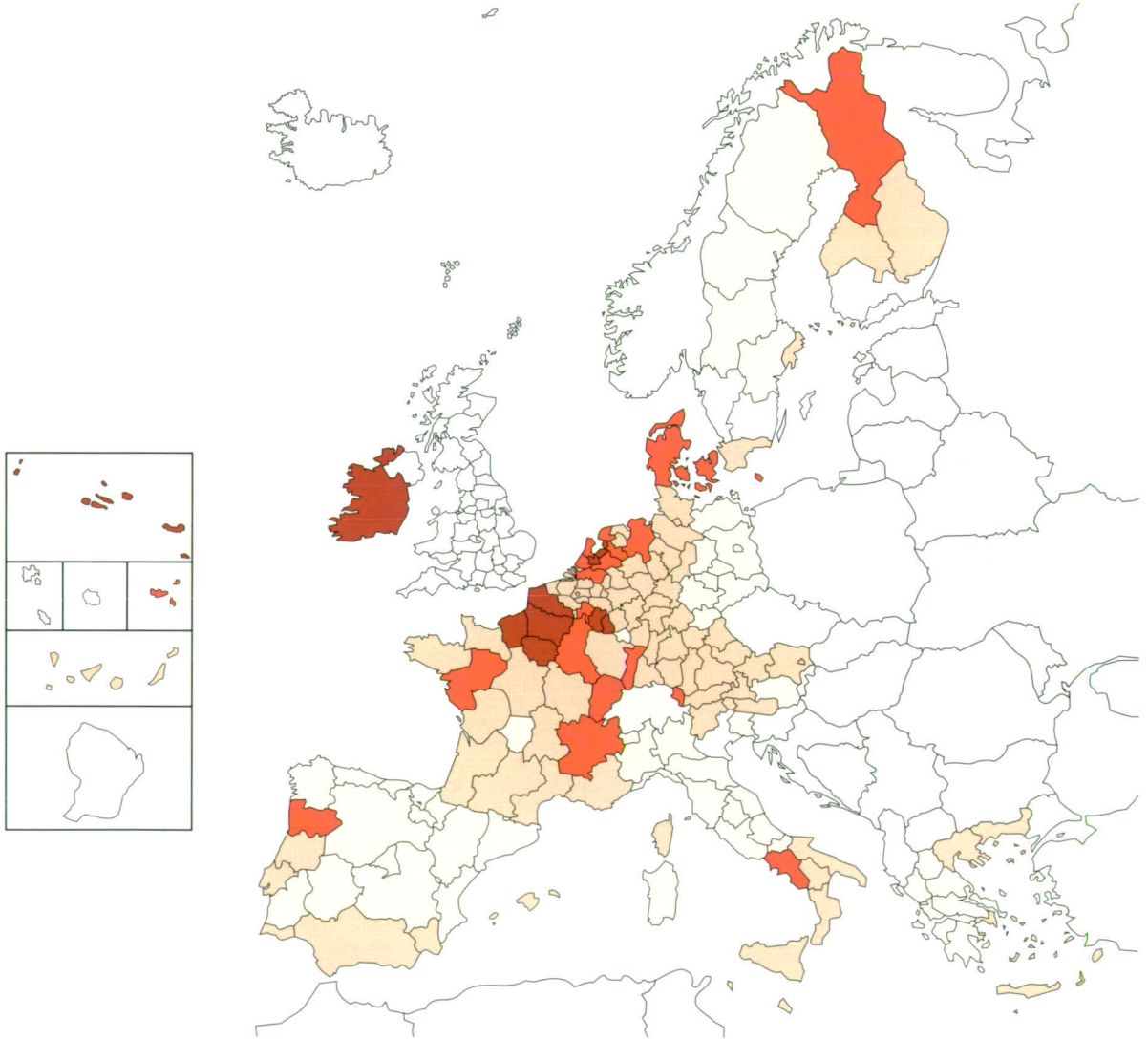


## 17.7. Unemployment rate. 1999



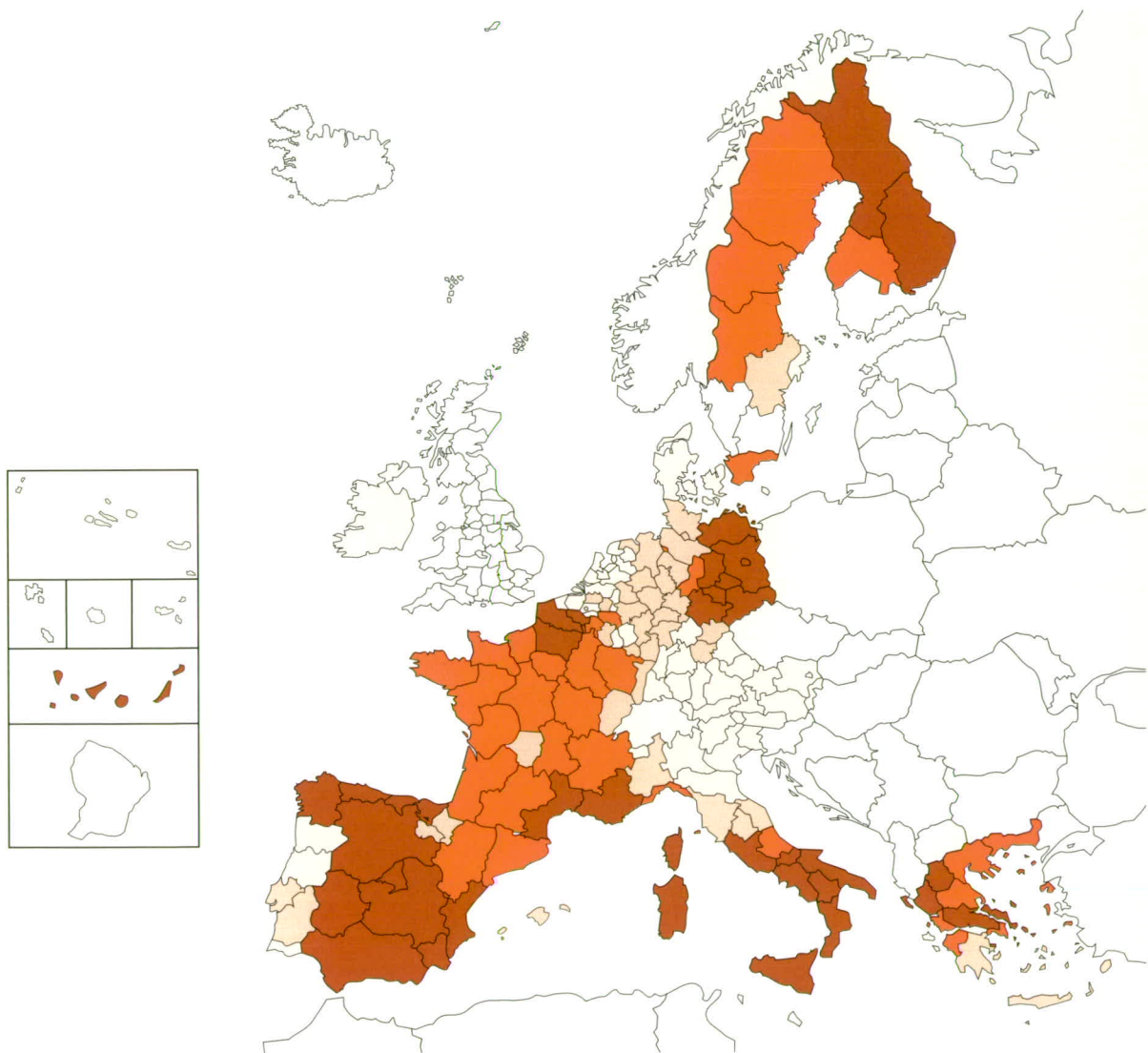

#### Nueva dirección del Instituto de Estadística (22/07/98)

A partir del día 1 de Agosto de 1998 la Dirección del Instituto de Estadística de la Comunidad de Madrid es: Plaza de O'Donnell, 2ª planta, 28003 Madrid.



El nivel de estudios del conjunto de los extranjeros que viven en la Comunidad de Madrid es superior al de los españoles. (2/09/98)

En relación con el extranjero, los extranjeros poseen una tasa de paro ligeramente mejor que los españoles, de acuerdo a los datos elaborados por la Estadística de Población de 1997. Temas 2

La población de la Comunidad de Madrid crecerá a un ritmo muy lento (en torno a 15.000 habitantes/año) hasta alcanzar alrededor de los 5.260.000 habitantes en el año 2011. (3/09/98)

De acuerdo con el avance de resultados de las Pruebas de Acceso a la Universidad de Madrid de 2001 se espera en este período que se aparezcan reconocimientos estadísticos negativos que ya ha empezado lentamente a aparecer en España a nivel de CC.LL.

#### Los precios de consumo crecen un 0,2% en julio (13/08/98)

La tasa de inflación de la Comunidad de Madrid es inferior en 0,2%, una décima por encima de la de junio. En España el crecimiento fue de un 0,4% situándose la tasa de inflación en el 2,2%.

#### Continúa el descenso acelerado del paro registrado en julio (12/08/98)

El paro registrado descendió en 1.100 personas frente al mes anterior (-4,2%) situándose en 221.242 personas (que son el 11,7%, la tasa baja de los últimos años). La cifra baja, como es previsible, se produjo en el sector de servicios.

#### Las empresas industriales de la Comunidad de Madrid gastan más de 175.000 millones de pesetas en innovación tecnológica. (25/08/98)

La inversión en innovación tecnológica se ha incrementado un 33% en dos años.



#### La jornada efectiva de trabajo en Madrid es de las más largas de España. (21/08/98)

En 1996 el número medio de horas trabajadas y días perdidos fue de 1.713,6 (11 horas eones y la media), mientras que las horas efectivamente trabajadas fueron 1.661,1 (16 más que la media).

#### Prosigue el envejecimiento relativo de la estructura de la población de la Comunidad de Madrid. (2/09/98)

Se trata de un envejecimiento producido por la reducción de la mortalidad y de la migración según se detalla en el informe de la Estadística de Población de 1997. Temas 2

#### Confirma la moderación de los precios industriales (21/08/98)

Los precios industriales en junio, situándose la tasa anual en el 0,9%, la misma que la de mayo.

#### Los sueldos madrileños son los mayores de España. (19/08/98)

El coste laboral por trabajador (4,5 millones) y los sueldos y salarios (3,4 millones) anuales que se dan en Madrid son mayores que los del resto de Comunidades Autónomas.

#### La enseñanza tiene nombre de mujer. Ya hay más mujeres que hombres estudiando. (21/08/98)

El grado de escolarización de la mujer en la Comunidad de Madrid supera el de hombre en casi todos los estudios.

#### El Índice de Producción Industrial de la Comunidad de Madrid aumentó en Mayo un 2,5% sobre el mismo mes del año anterior. (10/07/98)

En los últimos doce meses la producción industrial ha crecido un 7,1% frente a los doce meses anteriores.

#### El crecimiento de la industria madrileña en los últimos meses por encima del de la nacional y la europea. (12/08/98)

El crecimiento de la industria de la producción industrial de los últimos meses por encima del de la nacional y la europea. En los últimos meses la producción industrial de la Comunidad de Madrid, del 1,9% en España y del 1,7% en Europa.

#### En el segundo trimestre de 1998 el empleo aumentó en 58.200 personas en nuestra Comunidad, lo que supone un aumento del 3,4% sobre el trimestre anterior. (29/07/98)

La población activa de nuestra Comunidad creció un 3,4% sobre el trimestre de junio de 1998. Este aumento sigue siendo consecuencia del ritmo de descenso de los parados.

#### Se mantiene una débil recuperación de la fecundidad en nuestra Comunidad (1/07/98)

El indicador sintético de fecundidad es inferior en 1,43 hijos por mujer, con lo que se produce por mujer un menor número de hijos que en el resto de las comunidades autónomas.

#### En la Comunidad de Madrid existen cerca de 350.000 empresas activas de las cuales casi 200.000 se dedican a servicios distintos del comercio. (19/08/98)

Del total de 340.776 empresas activas, 36.099 son industriales, 31.247 de construcción, 29.803 de comercio y 192.322 del resto de los servicios.

#### La economía madrileña creció en 1997 un 4,0% según el nuevo indicador del VAB no agrario (ISALAS) elaborado por el Instituto de Estadística de la Comunidad de Madrid. (16/06/98)

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
